Chaplain Chats ~ Campus Chaplain, Dan Brookey

Recently our son's family took an overnight trip to northern Arizona. They had a good time and enjoyed a few tourist spots along the way. Most of the time we have the privilege of tagging along with the family, but that time we couldn't. The funny thing is our granddaughter kept asking where we were and when she would see a vehicle like ours, she would say with excitement "Grandma and Grandpa". She would have to be reassured that we were not able to come along with them on the trip. Traveling is always fun, at least for me. I enjoy seeing other places and meeting new people. It always takes a lot of planning though. When we decide to be on the move, we begin the planning phase. Where will we go, what will we do, how will we get there, and figuring how much it will cost. Planning is in the details. It struck me the other day when, in Romans 8, the Apostle Paul tells the Romans that God sent his son into the world to do what the law of God could not. The law could not afford righteousness, but the Son of God could. For what the law was powerless to do because it was weakened by the flesh, God did by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh to be a sin offering. And so he condemned sin in the flesh, in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fully met in us, who do not live according to the flesh but according to the Spirit. Those who live according to the flesh have their minds set on what the flesh desires; but those who live in accordance with the Spirit have their minds set on what the Spirit desires. Romans 8:3-5. What intrigued me was the thought of what the planning phase was like regarding Jesus' coming as a man to take away the sins of the world. What do you think that conversion was like? I think this might have been something that was determined at the beginning of time, or at least at the time when Adam and Eve were part of the original sin.
