


May this season remind us all of the joy that comes from sharing love with others.

I remember the Valentines Day celebrations in elementary school. It was a time of exchanging Valentines Day cards with everyone else in the class. I would get a bit excited and somewhat embarrassed. I usually didn't know what to say on the card so I wouldn't say anything. There would always be someone in class that captured my attention throughout the year. When I opened her valentine that said "Be Mine" I thought, how nice, she likes me. But then I would remember that she, like everyone else, gave a card to everyone in the class. Entering adulthood, I came to the realization that love is so much more than a cheesy card offered without thought. Love runs through our spirit like blood flowing through our veins. Love promotes value and is a facet of life that fosters completeness. God is love. His love does this as well. There is life in blood. This is true for the blood that flows through us and the blood that was given for us on the Cross.
